Wetlands Walks

This guided tour provides an excellent opportunity for students to be exposed to the beauty and importance of our wetlands.

Bivalve's salt marsh provides a vital habitat for plants & animals, including migrating birds, spawning species and their freshly hatched young. They also prevent flooding and provide storm drainage, improve water quality, and minimize erosion of upland areas.

Students will learn about the impact of human activity on wetlands, and help make a positive one by picking up trash and recyclables during the walk.



Engage in hands-on identification of birds, plants and marine life and learn about why wetlands are so important to migratory birds.

Come and experience the sights, the sounds, the smells, even the textures, that this diverse resource has to offer!

Museum Tour

Step back in time to the early 1900's and visit the thriving oyster industry of Maurice River Cove. Through photos, artifacts and oral histories, the Delaware Bay Museum & Folklife Center preserves the essence of its people, their heritage and their legacy.
