

### Wetlands Walks

This guided tour provides an excellent opportunity for students to be exposed to the beauty and importance of our wetlands.

Bivalve's salt marsh provides a vital habitat for plants & animals, including migrating birds, spawning species and their freshly hatched young. They also prevent flooding and provide storm drainage, improve water quality, and minimize erosion of upland areas.

Students will learn about the impact of human activity on wetlands, and help make a positive one by picking up trash and recyclables during the walk.



Engage in hands-on identification of birds, plants and marine life and learn about why wetlands are so important to migratory birds.

### Hands-on, interactive exploration

As part of your visit to the Bayshore Center at Bivalve, choose from several hands-on activities... play one of our migration games, explore shipbuilding tools and techniques or take part in reenacting the jobs of the men and women of the oyster industry.
