This year we focused on a strategic port schedule, advanced advertising campaigns, and rebuilding relationships with our community. We were excited to visit the port of Trenton in the spring working with Mercer County Parks. We signed a three year port visit with the Delaware River & Bay Authority to sail from the Cape May Lewes Ferry Terminal. We had two port visits this year with overwhelming success. We partnered with the New Jersey State Park Service at Liberty State Park with sails in New York Harbor with views of the Statue of Liberty and lower Manhattan.

The Delaware Bay Museum invested in shifting several exhibits to focus on visitor engagement and utilizing exhibit space for interactive education programming. Please visit our new exhibit focusing on A.J. Meerwald and her life's journey over the past century.

This year saw growth in volunteers and volunteer hours throughout the organization. We will continue to expand our volunteer training programs in 2025.

In the spring of 2024, the Bayshore Center identified the next milestones for the organization. Looking forward, our goal is to build a 21st century history and environmental education center for youth and adults on land and on water, building capacity focused on education. This year we launched a new summer camp for youth. We look forward to building programs around the new five pillars of community education: Oyster Reefs & Ecosystems; Coastal Resilience; Bayshore History & Culture; Marine Technology; and Sustainability & Stewardship.

Our Mission, Vision, and History

Mission

Through the state's official tall ship, the oyster schooner *A. J. Meerwald (AJM)* and historic waterfront museum, the Bayshore Center at Bivalve (BCB) will advance the understanding of the human impact on New Jersey's aquatic environment through education, advocacy, and programming.



Vision

BCB envisions a New Jersey with clean, safe and healthy water for recreation, consumption and commercial fishing.

About

BCB "Where History and the Environment Meet" was founded in 1988. It is an organization focused on using local history featured in our Delaware Bay Museum, combined with hand-on learning aboard our floating classroom, the 1928 Oyster schooner *AJM*. The organization is housed in the historic 1904 Oyster Shipping Sheds & Wharves located in Port Norris (Bivalve), NJ.

BCB was founded by Meghan Wren and John Gandy to save *AJM*, a Delaware Bay Oyster Schooner. In 1996, *AJM* was listed on the National/State Register of Historic Places and was given the title by Gov. Whitman as the Official Tall Ship of New Jersey in 1998, but without funding..

What started out as a grassroots effort has grown into a professional staff of 10 plus a seasonal crew including a well-respected and proficient Museum Curator and a ship's Captain. The organization is a proud ambassador of New Jersey's maritime history both on land and sea.

Where We Work


The Bayshore Center at Bivalve works with schools and organizations throughout the tristate area of New Jersey, Delaware, and Pennsylvania. The majority of youth educational programs come from Cumberland, Cape May and Atlantic County.

Oyster Schooner A. J. Meerwald (AJM)

3,419 passengers sailed aboard *AJM* on a "Public Sail" in 2024, experiencing her history, connection with local waterways and the environment and her ongoing support of the oyster industry.

A. J. Meerwald visited **11** ports, with **147** public sails and a total of **3,594** tickets sold.

- Our goal ticket sales was 60%
- Our average ticket sales was 49%
 - This ranged from a 15% ticket sales average in Bristol, PA and an 88% average in Trenton.
- Most of our individual sails averaged between 50% -65% ticket sales.
- Our average passenger capacity per sail was 72%
 19 sails were canceled due to weather.
- In addition, 8 private sailing charters were held with approximately 350 passengers.

The Delaware Bay Museum

The Delaware Bay Museum had **1,473** visitors this year plus approximately **6,000** that visited during fundraising and community-based events throughout the year.

Exhibit Update

- A new exhibit was created featuring the history of our schooner *A.J. Meerwald*, and Al Huber's collection, which helped form the museum. The exhibit features the maritime history of AJM, the Meerwald family, and vessel specifications.
- The "Play on the Bayshore" recreation exhibit was moved and reinstalled in the "silver room".
- The Abundant Oyster oyster shucking house exhibit was moved upstairs.
- Museum volunteers and our intern helped with the move, reinstalling, spackling and painting and updating the collection database.

- <u>Wooden Boat Magazine</u> wrote a major feature article on *A.J. Meerwald*. It is authored by Randy Peffer (author of the highly regarded book *Watermen* and retired teacher from Andover). He conducted interviews with John Gandy, Clark & Eisele, etc. The article is 7 pages long and includes several phonographs in the November/December 2024 issue.
- NOAA Voices from the Fisheries now has 27 transcribed oral histories and recordings posted.<u>https://voices.nmfs.noaa.gov:8453/collection/new-jerseys-delaware-bayshore</u> It can also access through the museum info page on BCB's website.
- Andy Urban, Associate Professor of American Studies and History at Rutgers New Brunswick received grant funding from Mellon to fund a NJ Im/migrant Laborer's Project that includes programming and public art. BCB was asked to serve as a site for a community dialogue session, suggest facilities and artists and host a public event in 2025 with regards to migration and labor. Other South Jersey partners include Seabrook Farms museum, Noyes Museum and WheatonArts.
- Black Heritage Trail- successful nomination of Bivalve, Shellpile and Maurice River to the NJ Black Heritage Trail. Approx.30 sites were accepted out of 60+. A plaque will be installed at BCB.

Collection Highlights

Print of the A.J. Meerwald, 1959 Artist: Florence Errickson Meerwald (1902-1969)

Florence's husband William A. Meerwald and his brother, Augustus C., built and operated *AJM*. Florence and her sister-in-law Edna James Meerwald became owners after a bankruptcy sale in 1935. The original painting was given to Florence's grandson Frank Unkle. His widow, Connie Ross, rediscovered the painting in 2022. During this time, *AJM* was undergoing a restoration and it was decided to paint the boat the color and order of the stripes used by Mrs. Meerwald. Thank you to Connie and the Unkle family for donating a beautiful print!

Education Programs

1,906 youth participated in educational programs with the Bayshore Center at Bivalve in 2024. Field trips held at our home port at the Bayshore Center include a robust experience consisting of a 2 hour education sail with 4 education stations onboard and a 2 hour visit to the Delaware Bay Museum with 4 land based stations. Field trips held at visiting ports consist of a 2 ½ hour sail with 4 education stations.

This year we piloted a Maritime Careers & Tech Ed program with the Atlantic Highlands Sailing Education Program, highlighting careers and systems aboard AJM.

In the spring of 2024, the Bayshore Center spent a significant amount of time identifying the next milestones for the organization. Our goal is to <u>build a</u> <u>21st century history and environmental education</u>



<u>center for youth and adults on land and on water</u>. Our vision for the future centers around building capacity focused on education. This includes a two year \$1.5M plan to create financial sustainability for the organization while building new partnerships and educational programs.

This is a groundbreaking initiative for the organization, and we are so grateful for the tremendous support in 2024. Through this annual appeal, it is our goal to raise an additional \$50,000. We need your help.

2024 Support for the Education Capacity Building in 2024 went directly toward:

- > Hiring museum and education interns.
- > Piloting a new summer camp curriculum and facilitating curriculum development.
- > Scholarships were provided to students for education sails and programs.
- Hiring an Education Director who will initially focus on local programs and partnerships in Cumberland County.

Community Events

Second Fridays

Approximately **5,500** people visited the Bayshore Center for Second Fridays in 2024. These events are free to the public. BCB invites the community out on the wharves and opens the museum with the goal of connecting the community with the local environment. It provides the opportunity to walk back in time, learn something new, relax by the water and enjoy fresh oysters harvested by local watermen and women.

Each month an expert presents on a topic connecting and informing the public on our ecosystems, marinelife, and connecting our history to today. 2024 topics included the American Oyster Catcher presented by Emmy Casper; Earth, Wind & Ice: Ancient Climate Change to Periglacial Landscapes presented by Mark Demitroff; Jim Blumenstein on The Great Migration of



Oystermen and more. Experts also shared current research and innovative solutions to today's challenges of sea level rise, erosion, and coastal resiliency. Special thanks to our sponsors for supporting these events.

Fundraising

The Bayshore Center at Bivalve held several fundraising events in 2024. The biggest success was the NJ Oyster Festival with over 500 tickets sold, lots of local oyster vendors, and sponsors. Fundraising events in 2024 more than doubled in revenue since 2023. In 2024, event sponsorships, ticket sales and raffle income totaled **\$60,106.** In 2023, fundraiser revenue totaled **\$28,880**.

A. J. Meerwald Mainsail - Fundraising Campaign

In the fall of 2023, the Bayshore Center at Bivalve initiated a campaign to raise the funds for a

new mainsail. Our previous mainsail carried us through some great achievements and some challenging times here at the Bayshore Center. The aged sail safely powered the A.J. Meerwald along the coast of New Jersey, up to New England and throughout the Delmarva Peninsula for almost 20 years. Our aged mainsail was raised for the last time as our captain and crew sailed home from Sultana downrigging in Chestertown, MD in November of 2023.

The mainsail was crafted by Traditional Rigging Co., an independent Maine loft specializing in sails and rigging for vessels of every size from the 17th century to the early 20th. Located in Appleton, ME the loft is run by Tom and Dayle Ward.



The new sail arrived in March of 2024 and was bent on by our crew in late April. This was the final piece of the original vision of the 2021-2022 million dollar restoration which began back in 2016. This year, A. J. Meerwald is 96 years old. Thanks to the craftsmanship, dedication, and perseverance of our supporters. She will hopefully continue to connect youth and adults to the Delaware Bayshore for generations to come. In the words of one donor, "My contributions to the organization have been made to honor the vision, commitment, and work ethic of those who brought the boat back to life."

In 2024, BCB had its first full year of programming both in its home port of Bivalve and throughout the state with a full itinerary of sailing programs.


By reestablishing strong relationships with ports in New Jersey to bring its educational programs to both students and adults, BCB saw a 57% increase in Program Revenue in 2024.



Grants

BCB received an operating support grant from the New Jersey Historical Commission, a division of the Department of State. This grant helps support staff-time, museum operations and overhead, and community events.

BCB received project grant funds from the NJ Historic Trust for a project that includes an underwater piling study of the facility and wharves (Nov 24), replacing the





geothermal HVAC unit at BCB (Jan 25), a new propeller to enhance maneuverability (Oct 25) including haul out.
